MAGISTRATES—WHO ARE THEY? WHAT DO THEY DO?

President Leslie Cox introduced fellow San-Lee Sunrise Rotarian Jim Cole for a program describing the North Carolina Magistrate system as a part of the North Carolina Unified Court System.

Jim stated that the Magistrate Court system was designed to be a convenient, inexpensive and non-technical 'Court of the People'. The principal function of the Magistrate is to provide an independent and unbiased review of complaints brought to the magistrate by law enforcement officers and the general public. As judicial officers of the District Court, magistrates have jurisdiction in certain stages of both criminal and civil cases.

Some of the duties of magistrates in criminal cases is to decide whether or not there is probable cause to have a case brought to trial and if there is enough probable cause what type of process should be issued to get the defendant to court, determine whether or not a defendant is entitled to bail and set bail when required, and release defendants from jail on bond.

Some of the duties of magistrates in civil cases are to hear matters involving money or property with a value not exceeding \$ 5000.00, evictions from rental property, and to decide whether or not probable cause exists for involuntary mental commitments.

Magistrates are nominated for office by the Clerk of Superior Court, appointed by the Chief Resident Superior Court Judge and Supervised by the Chief Resident District Court Judge.

The Office of Magistrate can trace it's development through centuries of English and American history. In North Carolina, the Office of Magistrate has evolved and improved from the Justice of the Peace system which the Magistrate system replaced approximately 35 years ago.

1. Go to <http://www.rotary.org/support/index.html>
2. Click on "Club District Support" in the menu bar at the top of the page.
3. On the list of options on the left side of the screen, highlight "Online Resources" and select "E-Clubs" from the pull down list.
4. Click on the PDF document: "Rotary E-Club Pilot Project—List of Clubs."
5. Click on the link to the club you want to make up with.
6. Follow the club's instructions. Usually they have you read and comment on some news articles about Rotary (a minimum of 30 minutes is required.)
7. They suggest a donation to their district in the amount you would have paid for lunch at a make-up meeting.
8. They will e-mail a confirmation of your make-up to you.
9. Print the e-mail and bring it with you to the next San-Lee Rotary meeting you attend.
