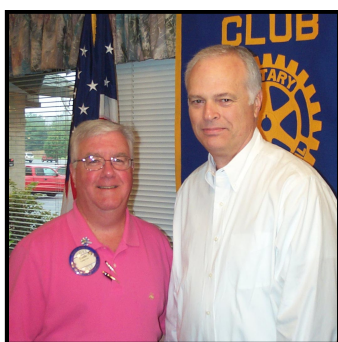
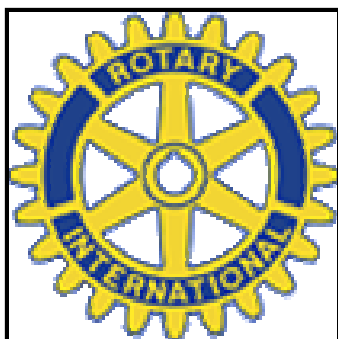

RETAIL PHARMACY "OUR PROBLEMS ARE YOUR PROBLEMS"

Local pharmacist Charles Clifford presented a passionate program at this week's meeting detailing the problems that Pharmacy Benefit Managers (PBMs) create for local independent pharmacists. Charles' oral and PowerPoint presentation focused on the "Big 3" PBMs that control 80% of the retail drug distribution market in the USA. Charles demonstrated the negative impact that PBMs have on medicinal drug distribution in NC and the nation. No other country in the world has PBMs and with our country now spending 14.6% of our GNP (Gross National Product) on health-care, Mr. Clifford demonstrated the negative economic value of PBMs' control of the distribution system. One of the "Big 3", Medco, is a major player in our area and 20 states now have lawsuit pending against this company.

MAKE UP ONLINE. THIS IS HOW YOU DO IT:

1. Go to <http://www.rotary.org/support/index.html>
2. Click on “Club District Support” in the menu bar at the top of the page.
3. On the list of options on the left side of the screen, highlight “Online Resources” and select “E-Clubs” from the pull down list.
4. Click on the PDF document: “Rotary E-Club Pilot Project—List of Clubs.”
5. Click on the link to the club you want to make up with.
6. Follow the club’s instructions. Usually they have you read and comment on some news articles about Rotary (a minimum of 30 minutes is required.)
7. They suggest a donation to their district in the amount you would have paid for lunch at a make-up meeting.
8. They will e-mail a confirmation of your make-up to you.
9. Print the e-mail and bring it with you to the next San-Lee Rotary meeting you attend.
