It headwaters in Alamance and Randolph Counties, flows southeast across Chatham and empties into the Deep River at the White Pines Nature Preserve. The Rocky River watershed is the site of three nationally significant aquatic habitats and eight natural heritage areas. The Rocky River is severely stressed. Stressors include excessive nitrogen and phosphorus, toxic chemicals, heavy metals, fecal coliform bacteria, sediment and low flows due to dams and climate change.
