Martin Davis introduced George Orlovsky, Safety Manager with Lee Iron and Metal, Inc., for a program describing the scrap recycling industry as the first link in the manufacturing supply chain and an important segment of the US economy, a positive factor in the US trade balance, and a positive force in reducing greenhouse gas emissions. Using statistics from the Institute of Scrap Recycling Industries, Inc. (ISRI), Mr. Orlovsky stated the scrap recycling industry was a \$71 billion industry in 2007 employing 85,000 workers in 'green jobs' and recycling 150 million tons of scrap into raw material feedstock for US manufacturers. This included 81.6 million tons of iron and steel, 50 million tons of paper and 576,000 tons of plastic bottles. \$21.7 billion of scrap was exported to 152 countries. Recycling conserves natural resources and reduces greenhouse gases by reducing the energy needed when using virgin materials. Recycling one ton of paper saves 17 trees, 79 gallons of oil, 7000 gallons of water, and 3.3 cubic yards of landfill. Recycling one ton of steel conserves 2500 lbs. of iron ore, 1400 lbs. of coal and 120 lbs. of limestone.
