Hayden Lutterloh introduced Scott Knuth, Battalion Commander, Sanford Fire Department for a program describing his service in the US Air Force Reserve at Balad Air Base, Iraq. Balad Airport is the second busiest airport in the world with 27,000 flights per month. The base covers 15 square miles and is located forty two miles north of Baghdad. Before service at Balad, Scott served as a Senior Master Sergeant with the 916th Air Refueling Wing at Seymour Johnson Air Force Base and with the 916th Security Forces Squadron at Langley Air Force Base. Balad Air Force Base in Iraq was known as Mortaritaville, and Scott demonstrated with a series of slides how the Base got that name.
