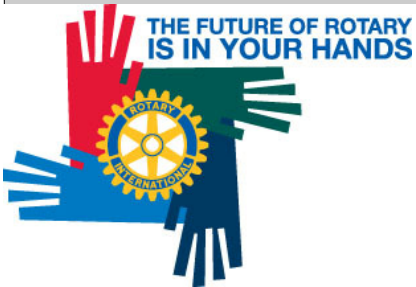

President Jensen introduced Ed Terry to present a multimedia presentation reviewing the "Flight of Honor" on Saturday, October 3rd. On that day, one hundred World War II veterans from Rotary District 7690 boarded a US Airways chartered flight from Greensboro to Washington, DC for a one-day trip to visit the WW II Memorial and other interesting sites. Member Ed Terry served as Guardian for three of the veterans, including Club member Fred Stuart who took the flight.

The veterans on the flight left early in the morning after a sendoff which included the Harley Honor Guard. Upon their arrival at Washington they were greeted by the Washington Fire Department and the Brass Section of the Washington Symphony Orchestra. The vets ha a full day, visiting the WWII Veterans Memorial, followed by visits to the Vietnam Veterans memorial, The FDR Memorial, The USMC War Memorial, The Air Force Memorial, and the Tomb of the Unknown Soldiers. The flight returned to Greensboro after 2:00 AM that night. Upon their return they were greeted by over one thousand people, including the fire department and the Harley Honor Guard to cap off a truly memorable day.
